In order to gain information about your child's behavior and progress, you might prepare some questions that directly address your area of concern. Here are some possible examples:

1. Does my child arrive to class with his/her completed homework and materials ready to start work?

- 2. Is my child able to work through a difficult question or task?
- 3. Is my child able to participate as part of a group?
- 4. Given a leadership role, does my child accept the added responsibility?5. Is my child able to think through problems?
- 6. Having resolved a conflict, can my child reflect on what he/she might do differently next time?
- 7. Is my child able to express his/her opinion in class?



Connors Project Lead the Way!

Thomas G. Connors PLTW 6TH grade classes have been learning about applied chemistry. The students were in for a sweet treat as they explored the roles of chemists and chemical engineers by making ice cream. The students worked in teams to mix ingredients as a chemist would for food corporations. Next, the groups prepared cooling chambers with gallon size freezer bags, ice, and salt. The students explored how the salt lowers the freezing point inside the bag and helps speed up the freezing of the ingredients. Each group had to use different methods of mixing the product. Some used an up and down shaking motion, rocking back and forth, flipping up and down, and kneading the ingredient bag over the ice. The students enjoyed comparing the differences in their final products to other groups in the room. What they enjoyed even more was how sweet their applied chemistry project tasted.
