



6th Grade Designs Trusses With Stevens Athletes

The 6th graders at Wallace School were visited by the Steven's Ducklings, a group of aspiring engineers who also have a role in athletics. Today's activity was to challenge the 6th graders to create a truss bridge. The students were presented with a problem: How does the structural design of bridges allow for them to hold such a great amount of force?

Students were actively engaged in the activity testing force and weight distribution as well as understanding the importance of the design and planning process. The designs were amazing and the students as well as the Ducklings were able to put their truss bridges to the test. One sample held over 100 pennies. Working cooperatively with the Steven's Ducklings with hands-on STEM projects allows the students to truly understand the concept and enjoy themselves in the process.

COSTUME GUIDELINES

- 1. Costumes are to be in good taste (no gore, appropriate themes, etc).
- 2. Masks are not to be worn, as they may create a safety hazard.
- 3. Avoid costumes with big, baggy sleeves and skirts to avoid tripping.
- 4. Students should wear normal, everyday footwear, as permissible by the dress code. Students scheduled for physical education classes must still wear sneakers.
- No toy weapons are permitted, including but not limited to: guns, knives, swords, bows, etc
- 6. Clown costumes are prohibited.

There will be a parade around the perimeter of Wallace School for students in grades Pre-K thru 6 at 12:45pm. Parents are welcome to view the parade from the Willow Avenue or Clinton St. sidewalks.
