HISTORY IN PHILLY

On Thursday, October 20th, 2016, tenth & eleventh grade students from Hoboken High School visited Philadelphia, PA. The students were part of Mr. Taraszkiewicz' AP US History I & II classes. Admission to the National Constitution Center was sponsored by Sunoco through the Center's Young Citizens Scholarship Program.

The trip is a cornerstone for class discussion throughout the year, as the students will be challenged to connect various themes in history such as politics, economics, geography, national identity, and American culture. By experiencing the National Constitution Center's interactive exhibits, students are able to gain a better understanding of the role the Constitution plays in the lives of Americans.

Students were also able to take part in a special exhibit which focused on the "Powers of the President." This exhibit will fuel discussions throughout the year, as the courses will cover checks and balances, and seek to address many misconceptions Americans can often hold regarding what the President can and cannot do. Finally, the trip concluded with a stop at the US Mint where students witnessed the power of a modern factory in the production of US coin currency. This will serve as a starting point for discussions on the principles of trade in the American economy.



Ms. Chakov's sophomore and senior classes have been working on a theme project for the year based on **Eric LeGrand's** *Believe* and Hoboken High School's motto, "Believe, Achieve, Grow." Ms. Chakov's classes were so inspired by LeGrand's story that they thought about all the principles that they believe in as well. Next, the students created posters detailing what they believe in most. Some students believe they can make a difference, become a

doctor, a writer, a fashion designer, or simply just believe in themselves. The students printed photos of themselves holding their banners, and Ms. Chakov displayed the photos in her classroom in the form of a "B" for believe. This project was an excellent idea, as it is imperative to set goals in life. Next to come is an "Achieve" display and a "Growth" wall!



Mrs. McGreivey and Ms. Drumgoole of HHS were guest speakers for this group, part of the Passport to Learning program. Ms. Drumgoole has been rescuing cats for twelve years and Mrs. McGreivey has been fostering rescued kittens for three years.

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

Senior Ring Ceremony



Halloween Guidelines

Students wishing to participate will be allowed to wear costumes to school. Hoboken High School has set forth guidelines for Halloween. If a student does come to school dressed inappropriately, they will be asked to either remove or cover what is inappropriate. If a school remedy is not possible, a parent will be asked to pick up his/her child. **Exception: bringing a replica or fake weapon will result in suspension and/or expulsion from school.** We hope the students enjoy the day, but it is still an instructional day and academics will not be compromised by those who desire to celebrate the day inappropriately.

- *For safety reasons, masks or makeup should not cover the student's face in a manner that makes the student unrecognizable.
- *No hard plastic toy or replica guns/ weapons (swords, play knives, etc.) are allowed.
- *Costumes that are overly graphic, promote violence or otherwise might logically be assumed to be offensive to others are not acceptable.
- *Costumes that are sexually suggestive and would otherwise violate the school's dress code are not appropriate.
- *Costumes should not include items with sound effects, lights or other components, which would disrupt the classroom learning environment.
- *Due to recent concerns surrounding potential threats and inappropriate events nationwide, clown costumes will not be permitted at HHS.
- *Regarding costumes that may not be clearly addressed by these guidelines, students should be instructed to have the costume pre-approved by an administrator prior to wearing to school.
