Keep up the great work, Kindergarten!!





Monday, October 3, 2016 School Closed	Recognizing Bullying and Normal Conflict: Students learned on the following day what the words "respect" and "peace" meant. They gave examples in their classrooms and came up with their own vision of peace statements.	
Tuesday, October 4, 2016	Being Kind: Students created a classroom bucket to fill with acts of kindness they saw throughout the week. Students were encouraged to recognize peers in their classroom who they saw being kind or helpful to one another. It encouraged students to recognize that positive words make others feel better about themselves (filling our buckets) while negative words make us feel bad about ourselves (bucket spills).	
Wednesday, October 5, 2016	<b>Telling or Tattling?</b> Students learned the difference between telling something and tattling on someone. To encourage positivity, anytime a student was caught doing something positive, the student's name was listed on a brick along with their act of kindness. The bricks are being displayed on the first floor for all to see.	
Thursday, October 6, 2016	<b>Don't be a Bystander:</b> Students learned what it was to be a bystander and reviewed the bystander pledge hanging in their classroom.	
Friday, October 7, 2016	<b>RESPECT:</b> Students reflected on how they were respectful all week and what respect means to them. Some classrooms wrote about it, others sang songs, and some picketed in the building with creative posters!
