Connors Students Crack the Case!

As part of our inference lesson, students were transformed into junior detectives. There were two crime scenes set up in the classroom. As the anticipatory set, students had to use their schema and clues from the scene in order to make an inference to determine what happened in Mrs. Ortiz' classroom last night. There were chairs flipped over, remote controls thrown on the floor, bags of chips and drinks thrown, a "Game Over" image displayed on the Smartboard, and caution tape blocking off the area. As students analyzed the scene, they had to complete a graphic organizer in order to organize their thoughts and make a final determination.

In the second crime scene, we incorporated reading. Students had to read interviews of different people who came into contact with the victim. The interviews were divided into centers so that students had to rotate to each center in order to gather all the information and analyze it using a graphic organizer. As students worked, crime scene instrumental music played in the background in order to set the mood. Students had to take text evidence from the interview cards, clues from the crime scene, and use their schema in order to make an inference as to what happened to our victim. This crime scene had caution tape, the outline of a victim, a pot, a wooden spoon, a bottle of cyanide, a fork and knife, a plate, and on top of the plate a picture of fried chicken and corn.
