BUDGET BASICS




- Budget consists of expenditures & revenues
- Expenditures (salaries, benefits, insurance, regular education programs, special education programs & out of district tuition, co- and extra curricular programs, athletics, technology, capital projects, transportation, custodial & maintenance services, school-based budgets, security, capital projects, administrative services, and charter schools' transfer)
- Revenues (Local tax levy, state aid, federal aid, budgeted fund balance, rent, private contributions, interest on reserves, miscellaneous revenues, pilot revenue)
- 2% Tax Levy Cap (overview of Abbott ruling & S2) (only two ways to exceed the cap)
- Factor that impact the tax levy cap
- Per pupil cost comparison (ODD \$3,293,022 + Transportation) v.
 (Hola 4.99M) (ECS 3.5M) (HCS 3.4M)

LONGITUDINAL PK ENROLLMENT TRENDS



LONGITUDINAL GR. 6-12 ENROLLMENT TRENDS




LONGITUDINAL GR. K-12 ENROLLMENT TRENDS


